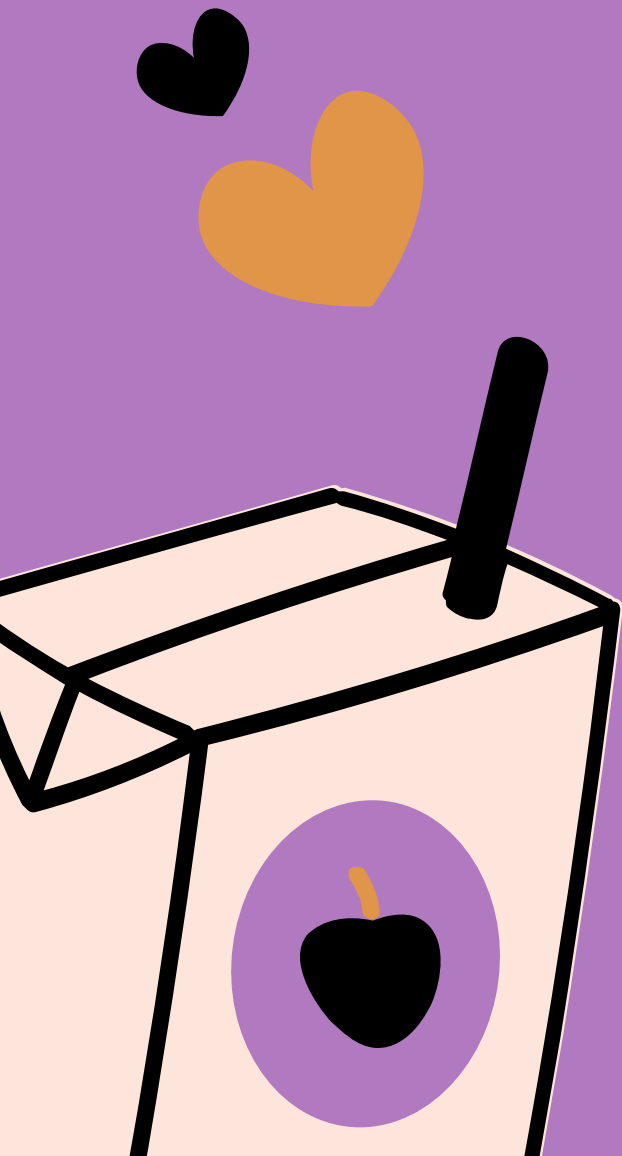

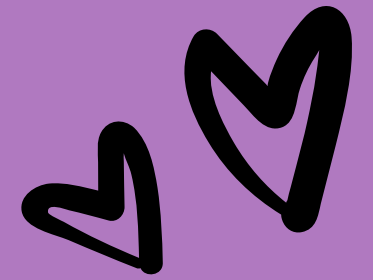

Women face greater climate risks, especially in rural areas. Addressing their vulnerability strengthens overall climate resilience.

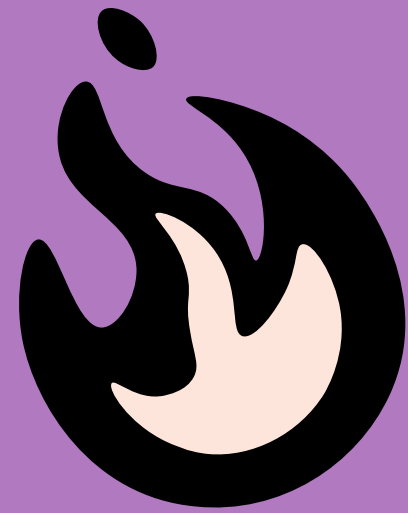

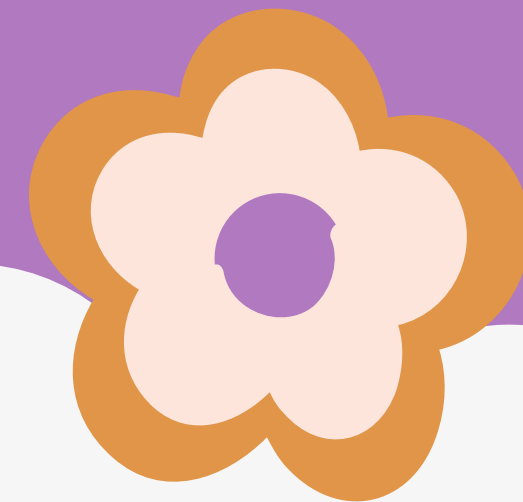




# Gendered Impact of Environmental Issues

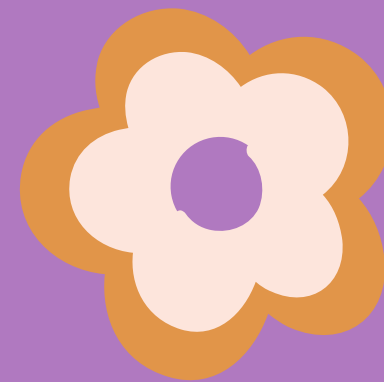
## Korina Villanueva
